

1 State Board of Education Resolution 2 On Sexual Assault Data 3 SR22-16 4 5 WHEREAS, the D.C. State Board of Education passed SR22-6, Recommendations Related to 6 Allegations of Sexual Assault and Abuse in Schools, at its public meeting in July 2022; 7 WHEREAS, SR22-6 calls for data to be made publicly available and incidents of sexual assault 8 9 and abuse at schools to be disaggregated by type and reported annually by the Office of the State 10 Superintendent of Education (OSSE); 11 12 WHEREAS, the State Board's Outreach and Advocacy Committee held a roundtable on sexual 13 assault in schools comprised of Advisory Neighborhood Commissioners (ANCs), the Child and 14 Family Services Agency (CFSA), DC Rape Crisis Center, the Office of the Ombudsman for Public 15 Education, and the Office of the Student Advocate in September 2022; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the key takeaways for that session were consistency in reporting of allegations of 18 sexual abuse or assault, training of individuals who interface with children and students, and 19 recommendations for data points that should be made publicly available. 20 21 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the D.C. State Board of Education recommends the 22 Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) explore methods for sharing sexual assault and harassment data to increase transparency on the issue, while still protecting the identities and 23 24 well-being of individuals who report these incidents and recognizing that appropriate data might 25 vary for elementary, middle, and high schools; 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that OSSE should provide intervention and implement action 28 plans with local education agencies (LEAs) with substantiated sexual abuse claims; and 29 30 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, OSSE provides an annual report to D.C. Council on sexual 31 assault cases in schools and they make the report and its data publicly available on its website— 32 ensuring the report includes but not be limited to the following: 33 34 • How many incidents were reported in schools annually; 35 • How many incidents were investigated: 36 • How many claims were substantiated; and • Identify individuals that may have been terminated and/or prosecuted due to sexual 37 38 assault or abuse.
