





Compared to student performance, which signals the share of students achieving at various levels, student progress is a measure of how much students grow from year to year. While some schools may have relatively few students meeting or exceeding state standards, it is important to gauge the extent to which those schools help students catch up.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

A growth percentile ranks have each student performed on this year's assessment compared with other DC students who had a similar achievement on the prior year's assessment. In order to compare the growth between schools, the median (or middle) growth percentile from each school's reported. For example, a score of 70 means that this school's median student outperformed more than 70 percent of students in the District with the same level of prior achievement on the PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Career) assessment.

 - Overall Satisfaction with the School.


